Interoperability Executive Committee Phone Conference Meeting June 1, 2009

WyoLink Applications

Discussion on the WyoLink applications that have been received since March 2009. There are two new applications, Carbon County Sheriff's Office and Bureau of Land Management - Wyoming. Bob Symons recommended the approval of the applications. Marty McCoy made a motion to recommend approval of the applications to the PSCC, seconded by Bob Dean. The motion passed on a voice vote.

Gov Delivery

Marty McCoy presented information on notification system, Gov Delivery. This will allow the delivery of information via text messages and email. WYDOT is currently using the system in the Transportation Management Center and WyoLink will be able to use the program at no cost. The system will be segment the messages by county and type. The users will be able to select the type of messages they wish to receive and by their county area. The system will be used to disseminate information pertaining to WyoLink functionality and outages. Dale Pawling made a motion to move forward with the Gov Delivery message notification system. Lauri Wempen seconded the motion. The motion passed on a voice vote.

Bob Symons informed the committee of the work that is being done to improve the interoperability section of the WyoLink Handbook for clarification on when and how to use WyoLink and other conventional channels for interoperability between agencies. This handbook revision will be presented to the Interoperable Executive Committee before the September PSCC meeting.

<u>Training</u>

Lanny Applegate stated the Fire Marshal's Office has two trained trainers ready to start training end users on WyoLink and Interoperability. The Wyoming Law Enforcement Academy has six trainers that have completed the training.

The meeting was adjourned at 2:43 pm.
