Phone Conference Meeting Minutes for March 14, 2011

Chairman Billy Janes called the meeting to order at 2:00 pm.

Members participating: Billy Janes, Lanny Applegate, Danny Glick, Bob Dean, Lauri Wempen, Steve Myrum, Robert Wilson and Bob Symons

Discussion on the WyoLink applications for Western Wyoming Community College and Buckskin Mine in Campbell County. Bob Symons has sent letters to both applicants for clarification on their applications. Western Wyoming Community College has stated their application is for the Protective Services Department. The Campbell County Emergency Management Agency has provided a letter in support of the Buckskin Mine application for the mine ambulance.

Lanny Applegate made a motion to remove from the table the WyoLink applications for Western Wyoming Community College and Buckskin Mine. Bob Dean seconded the motion and the motion passed on a voice vote.

Lanny Applegate made a motion to approve the WyoLink applications for Western Wyoming Community College Protective Services Department and Buckskin Mine ambulance. Bob Dean seconded the motion and the motion passed on a voice vote.

Four new applications have been received from Goshen County Road and Bridge, Weston County Fire Protection District, Goshen County Public Health and Laramie County Community College. The application for Laramie County Community College is for the Campus Safety and Security Department and includes a letter of support from Laramie County Sheriff Danny Glick.

Lanny Applegate made a motion to approve the WyoLink applications for Goshen County Road and Bridge, Weston County Fire Protection District, Goshen County Public Health and Laramie County Community College Campus Safety and Security Department. Bob Dean seconded the motion and the motion passed on a voice vote.

Bob Symons led a discussion on the licensing by the State of Wyoming for the National Public Safety Telecommunications Council (NPSTC) national interoperable conventional channels. It has been recommended by John Powell, NPSTC Interoperable Committee Chairman, that Wyoming license the VHF, 700 MHz and 800 MHz NPSTC interoperable channels, which will allow the PSCC to set up guidelines on the use of the interoperable channels. The Interoperable Executive Committee will have a future meeting to review more information and possibly make a motion on the licensing of the NPSTC channels.

Robert Wilson provided an update on the current status of the Link Wyoming Broadband mobile data survey and study. WYDOT will be meeting with Verizon on the data services available which may be used by WYDOT.

Motion to adjourn by Lanny Applegate, seconded by Bob Dean, motion passed on a voice vote.

Chairman Janes adjourned the meeting at 2:16 pm.
