Bob Symons called the phone conference meeting to order at 1:00 pm

Natrona County Request for 800 MHz channels

Discussion on request from Natrona County for seven 800 MHz channels for a new radio site at Alcove Reservoir. The Region 46 (Wyoming) 800 MHz plan is used to prioritize the use of the 800 MHz frequencies. The unassigned frequencies are on a first come first serve basis and Wyoming reviews the frequencies. Upon the review of the Region 46 800 MHz plan, the following channels have been assigned to Natrona County:

Channel 17	851.2250 – 806.2250
Channel 21	851.2750 – 806.2750
Channel 48	851.6375 – 806.6375
Channel 68	851.8875 – 806.8875
Channel 104	852.3625 – 807.3625
Channel 106	852.3875 – 807.3875
Channel 127	852.6750 – 807.6750

Channels 104 and 106 are .0250 MHz apart. Channel 101(852.3250 – 807.3250) would provide a separation of .0525 MHz with Channel 106. Channel 101 has not been assigned.

Martin McCoy made a motion to submit channels 17, 21, 48, 68, 101, 106 and 127 to Natrona County for presentation to their vendor for verification of use at the new 800 MHz site at Alcova Reservoir. If the vendor approves the list, then Natrona County may start the licensing process. The motion was seconded by Craig Post. The motion passed on a voice vote.

Bob Symons will create a letter from the Region 46 800 MHz Regional Planning Committee to Natrona County describing the actions of the RPC on March 18, 2014. The letter will include an intermod analysis for the selected channels.

800 MHz channels usage at Casper Mountain

The Regional Planning Committee reviewed the current 800 MHz usage at the Casper Mountain 800 MHz site. A letter between Casper and Sprint-Nextel was presented and reviewed by the RPC. The Region 46 RPC will work with Natrona County and their vendor to resolve the

frequency usage at the Casper Mountain 800 MHz site. A copy of the Casper-Sprint/Nextel November 9, 2007 letter is attached for reference.

Dan Perko made a motion to adjourn, seconded by Martin McCoy and passed on a voice vote. The meeting was adjourned at 1:40 pm.
