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Work has begun in downtown Cheyenne on Central and Warren Avenue where they cross the railroad tracks, also known as Interstate 180. Crews are replacing bridge joints and patching parts of the deck on both structures. Simultaneously, crews will be replacing concrete slabs on either side of the structures between Ninth Street and Lincolnway. The project is expected to finish in fall of 2020.

On Interstate 25 south of Chugwater, crews will be working on bridge rehabilitation at mm 41.8. Oversized loads will need to detour from exit 39 to exit 47 using an I-25 service road.

Contractors will also be completing various bridge repairs, slab repairs on on- and off-ramps and other work along I-25 through the city of Cheyenne.

In the northern part of the state, contractors will be working on Interstate 90's Prairie Dog section with an estimated completion date of late July. Work will be focused on the westbound travel lanes between the bridges at Desmet Ditch (mm 44.51) and Piney Creek (mm 44.12), as well as the westbound and eastbound lanes of the structures. Contractors will also be working on the westbound bridges at Machinery Pass (mm 37.56) and Prairie Dog (mm 37.16).

Non-Interstate Projects

One of the largest non-interstate projects is the continuation of work on the Jackson South reconstruction project near Hoback Junction on US Highway 26/89/189/191. The second half of a broader corridor improvement effort, crews will be grading, draining, paving, replacing a bridge and more. The \$67.5 million project also includes a detour for drivers as crews begin work on a wildlife crossing.

Another two-year project beginning this year on approximately nine miles of US 30 between Kemmerer and Opal involves bridge rehabilitation and other miscellaneous work. The estimated completion date is the end of June 2021.

In and around Douglas, crews have begun an \$11 million, two-year project this spring on WYO 59 and its junction with I-25. The project includes grading, upgrades to left and right turn lanes, new signals, reworking the interchange ramps and other work to improve efficiency at the interchange. Related to the project, work will also be completed on WYO 94 from south of the intersection to the Monroe

South of Gillette, crews will be working on WYO 50 beginning at the intersection of Force Road and 4-J Road. A new sidewalk and pathway, as well as fencing, landscaping and finish work, will be completed from West Lakeway south to the Force Road and 4-J Road intersection.

A \$3.3 million highway improvement project is underway through the town of Thermopolis on US 20/WYO 789. Scheduled work includes grading, milling, paving and a wearing course for 2.6 miles of roadway. Additionally, the project includes ADA upgrades to the intersections and replacing sidewalks, curbs and gutters as needed. Work is slated to be completed in June 2021.

Within the town of Cody, crews are working on a twoyear concrete rehabilitation project on US 14/16/20 between 10th Street and Stampede Avenue. Updates on that project, which runs through the heart of town, can be found on Twitter at #CodyImprovements.

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2020 construction season gets underway with warmer temperatures

Interstate and state highway projects ramp up for season

By Jordan Achs, District 1 Spring often means rising temperatures, melting snow and longer days, but it also marks the start of construction season for the Wyoming Department of Transportation.

WYDOT packs a lot of construction into a short season, which typically spans from late spring through early fall. That work is spread out over both interstates and highways statewide, and projects include on- and off-ramp repairs, pavement improvements, bridge rehabilitation and much more. Some projects involve upgrading sidewalks, curbs and gutters to be compliant with the regulations outlined in the Americans with Disabilities Act when necessary.

This construction is beyond WY-DOT's routine road maintenance work like filling potholes, repairing signs and replacing broken guardrails.

"Highway projects are selected based on system needs such as safety, capacity, roadside development, pavement and bridge condition," said Shelby Carlson, chief engineer of

The Transportation Commission has awarded more than \$163 million for construction projects in 2020, which is allocated to about 73 projects statewide. WYDOT periodically plans for projects up to six years in advance using a process called the State Transportation Improvement Program.

Projects in the STIP may shift from

year to year "based on available funding, unforeseen emergency repairs such as after landslides, complications related to environmental or right-ofway needs, etc," Carlson said.

With so many projects scattered around the state, travelers, commuters and commercial drivers hauling goods need to be mindful of work zones and stay alert for any changes in speed limits, lane reductions or new traffic patterns.

"Motorists should slow down and proceed with caution when traversing through highway work zones, paying careful attention to direction provided through construction traffic control devices and the presence of

workers, construction equipment and other travelers," Carlson said. "Resist the urge to look at the ongoing construction activity, which diverts your attention away from the roadway and where your vehicle is moving. Do this for your safety and the safety of the construction workers and other travelers."

Interstate Projects

Starting this summer, crews will begin work on a two-year project on 10 miles of Interstate 80 between Cheyenne and Pine Bluffs near Hillsdale. The project involves replacing two structures, repaying and other improvements along mile markers 372-382.

Legend

- Interstate highway work zones: Generally, there are no delays or detours. Travel may be narrowed to one lane (on pavement) each way and involve a reduced speed limit.
- Two-lane road projects: Motorists may be required to stop and wait to follow pilot cars. Usually, any delays are limited to 20 minutes or less and travel is on pavement.
- Two-lane road projects: At times, motorists may have to drive on gravel or another temporary surface, typically for two miles or less. Delays are limited, there are no detours unless specifically noted but there may be a pilot car.
- District-wide projects: Various locations, may involve reduced speeds.

Not every project is listed

Due to the unpredictable nature of the construction process, not all projects are active all the time. In addition, some short-term projects and smaller projects which disrupt traffic to a lesser degree are not listed. Completion dates are approximate.
