Subject: WyoLink Pre-Negotiated Pricing Agreement

The State of Wyoming has approved a revised Pre-Negotiated Pricing Agreement (PNPA) for WyoLink compliant equipment. The pre-negotiated pricing agreement is intended to provide a streamlined approach for any Wyoming agency to purchase subscriber radios, accessories, or vehicular repeaters with a manufacturer's guarantee of Project 25 Compliance and WyoLink trunking capability, certified to be priced at or below prices on their current WSCA or GSA pricing structures. All current and new vendors shall provide a letter of compliance certifying the vendor pricing is at or below WSCA or GSA pricing structures. The certification letter shall be sent to Bob Symons, Wyoming Public Safety Communications Commission, 5500 Bishop Blvd, Cheyenne, WY 82002 for posting on the WyoLink Equipment web page: <http://wyolink.state.wy.us/equipment.asp>

The vendor shall also provide their current pricing for WyoLink compliant radio equipment in a "pdf" format for posting on the WyoLink Equipment web page to bob.symons@wyo.gov by November 13, 2015. The WyoLink Equipment web page will be updated with the current pricing by November 30, 2015.

WyoLink, Wyoming's public safety interoperable communication system currently is operational at 72 sites providing approximately 94% mobile radio coverage statewide. Portable radio coverage has been improved in many communities. Since the initiation of the pre-negotiated pricing agreement in 2004, many of the envisioned features of WyoLink have become a reality. Consequently, we are requiring more detailed compatibility documentation for vendor offerings. The PSCC has decided that only vendor equipment that has been reviewed for P25 and WyoLink compatibility will remain on the pre-negotiated pricing agreement.

Requirements for Radios to be Certified for Use on WyoLink

1. Radio must have passed P25 Compliance Assessment Program (CAP) testing, and have Summary Documents of Compliance (SDOCs) posted on the Responder Knowledge Base (RKB).
 - a. The manufacturer may provide SDOCs to WyoLink, but they are not deemed official until they are posted on the RKB.
2. Manufacturer will provide WyoLink with Detailed Testing Results from the P25 CAP testing and certification process.
 - a. The manufacturer may, if they wish, restrict distribution of these Detailed Testing Results.
3. Manufacturer will provide at least one sample radio to WyoLink for evaluation and testing on the WyoLink system.
 - a. These radios are not required to remain with WyoLink.
 - b. Any radios that are provided on extended loan will be placed on display in the WyoLink Support Office with radios from other manufacturers that are certified for use on WyoLink.
