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WyoLink is Wyoming's statewide public safety interoperable radio communications system.

1 -	1 - WyoLink Contract Signed with Motorola																																									
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1) This morning a procurement contract was signed between Wyoming Department of Transportation and Motorola Inc. to provide WyoLink System Equipment and Development Services. The proposal evaluation process deemed the Motorola proposal to be the apparent best value, presenting both a mature technology that met the system requirements and presenting the lowest cost.

The \$20.6M contract will provide a 57 site, VHF, project 25, trunked radio system with resources for integrated voice and data providing automatic vehicle location and mobile data technology. The system will be developed using radio sites and microwave links established by the Department of Transportation. The contract provides for an aggressive development schedule, with elements of the first project phase on the air in March of 2005 and the entire first phase completed that July. Based on available funding, development may be extended as far as a Rawlings and Casper by the end of 2005. Completion of statewide development is slated for the end of 2007. The contract also provides a vehicle through which Wyoming public safety agencies will be able to procure equipment based on the same cost structure use for the system infrastructure.
