State project DR13171, involving grading, drainage, crushed base and bituminous pavement for crossovers and damage repair to the Parsley Boulevard Bridge, which crosses over Interstate 80, and miscellaneous work on 1.080 miles of I-80, beginning at reference marker (RM) 361.49, in the city of Cheyenne, in Laramie County.
