
No doubt, one of the primary areas of interest to our customers right now is the new electronic signature and electronic filing process. We have dedicated the entire second page to providing our customers with a comprehensive update, but as front-page news, let us share the part of the update related to the projected "go live" date. We, along with our IT and Financial Systems partners, anticipate a mid-August 2018 transition to the new filing process. Thanks to our customers and several vendors, we have done a good amount of testing already, and we anticipate several more rounds of testing prior to going live. While a good amount of FTA Leadership's time has been spent working on the aforementioned electronic signature and filing process, the remainder of the FTA Team has been focused on bringing customer accounts "current" while accomplishing cross-training in some areas. Considering where we were several years ago or even a year ago, we have come a long way towards achieving our goal of becoming "current" with account work. We did experience some employee turnover at the end of the year, so we're in the process of adding a new member to the team. As you all know, losing an experienced team member equates to a short-term loss in productivity and a shift in the workflow, but we remain committed to the goal of becoming current and we will get there.

On the team topic, the last four months have

seen the FTA Team accomplish a good amount of individual and collective innerwork that relates to team building and strategic planning. From core values identification to completion of Strengthsfinder 2.0 and the Myers-Briggs Type Indicator (MBTI), the FTA Team is completing the foundational steps to building a highly effective and highly functioning team. If you've been reading this newsletter for a number of years, this likely sounds very familiar as we continually keep a threepronged approach: Technical, strategic and team. This multi-focus not only makes us more effective and efficient, but it also keeps work interesting.

On the strategic planning front, WYDOT programs are expected to build a three year strategic plan using the Balanced Scorecard strategic planning tool. FTA has been very active with this process in the past although the last three year period proved very challenging (as you all know) with retirements, transfers, etc. While we achieved a good number of strategic activities, we did not work our plan with the intense focus that we typically do. We are now poised to develop a new three year strategic plan for Fuel Tax Administration, and we will begin that process in the second quarter of this year. While there will be some diversion from previous plans, please rest assured that, as in the past, our strategic plan will be centered on you, the customer. Our commitments to partner with our customers and achieve our mission effectively and efficiently have not waivered, and we anticipate the ability to equitably split our focus over the next three years to achieve the goals we identify in our new strategic plan. As always, once we have the plan developed we will share it here as we want you to know where we are headed both technically as well as strategically.







# Electronic Signature Update

Please accept our apologies for the lack of continuing communication related to this project. While we've had the opportunity to have one-on-one conversations with customers concerning the project, we have not had the opportunity to share an update collectively.

The electronic signature project (as it has become known as) continues moving towards implementation. As many of you are aware, it is now much more than just the ability to sign the coversheet electronically. Let's take a few minutes to cover exactly what this new process is going to look like.

Let's start by explaining our goal: Our goal is to create a one-stop—shop for FTA customers where electronic returns can be uploaded, supporting documentation can be attached, and payment can be made. The hold-up on our end has been working

to figure out the last element—a "Pay Now" option—and we believe we have arrived at a viable solution. We are now working to refine and test the "Pay Now" option to ensure its effectiveness. While we are aware that the end product will not likely be utopia, we do believe it will be a drastic improvement in both process and efficiency.

Prior to the transition, we need to ensure that we have provided all of the relevant information to our customers, received all required documentation from our customers, and hopefully answered all of your questions. Several months ago we sent Electronic Signature **Trading Partner** Agreements to all customers, and we have received the majority of them back. If you have not vet submitted the Trading Partner Agreement, please return it to us as soon as possible as a signed agreement will be required for

you to file electronically in the new system.

Customers will still file either EDI or CSV files through a portal on the website. There are new EDI specifications that will need to be employed when this process goes live. Until then, customers will need to continue using the current EDI specifications. The new EDI specifications are posted on the FTA website in two formats: One format is simply the proposed new EDI specifications, and the other format highlights the actual changes to the EDI specifications.

We are continuing to diligently work through all of the elements related to this project (there are so many!), and we are attempting to be patient as all the pieces come into place. The anticipated transition to this new process is now mid-August 2018, but we are optimistic it will be worth the wait.

WYDOT is transitioning to a new data center. Please make this change immediately: Change for Fuel Tax Customers using 'fueltax' FTP user: Replace

pchlwydot05.dot.state.wy.us with erp-ftp.dot.state.wy.us as the Host Name in your FTP client

User 'fueltax' credentials will remain the same. FTA customers will not need to make any further changes when we cut over to the new data center. IT will re-direct erp-ftp.dot.state.wy.us from the current server to the new server at the time of go-live cutover (scheduled for 4/13).

On the initial connection using erp-ftp.dot.state.wy.us, you may be asked for confirmation to add this new entry to your cache. Please accept that change. Once we transition (scheduled for 4/13), FTA customers will no longer be able to transfer files using the current pchlwydot05.dot.state.wy.us Host Name.

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### Wyoming Hosting FTA Pacific Region Conference
