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





2024	~\$320M	Planned = 97	

- Delayed approximately \$70M in FY23 to FY24
- Based on current prices, had to either move projects back or reduce scope to account for approximate \$100M over budget in FY24

Federal vs State Funding

- National Average 70% State / 30% federal
- Wyoming 29% State / 71% Federal


- Generally, \$100M additional funding per year / requires matching funds
- Congress must still appropriate funding for most core programs on a yearly basis
- Discretionary Grants competitive grants creating new and increasing existing funding opportunities requires matching funds which we likely will not have available
- Once federal funds start to become available, the agency will use its Guiding Principles to determine the best use of funds to achieve the maximum benefit to Wyoming

Construction – Ongoing Projects



- Interstate projects
- Two-lane road projects pilot car paved surface detour
- Two-lane road projects gravel or temporary surface detour
- District wide projects



Bridge Formula Program (BFP) - Local Projects

- 2022 Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (Bipartisan Infrastructure Law) dedicated funding for bridges
 - Replace or rehabilitate bridges in poor condition
 - \$45 million/year for 5 years (\$225 million)
 - Minimum 15% (\$6.75 million/year) to off-system bridges.
 100% federal funds on qualifying bridges
- Planned to address 44 bridges in poor condition
- Seeing large increase in unit bridge costs
 - Average has gone from \$175/sf to \$400/SF
 - Will continue to fund the off-system bridges currently in the program





I-80 — Winter Freight BUILD Project

- Continuation from previous years






