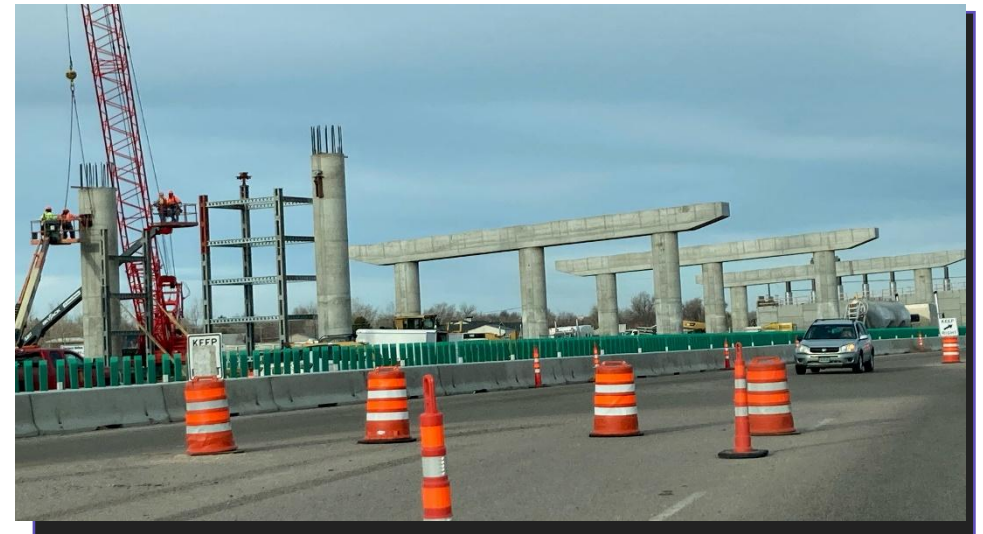

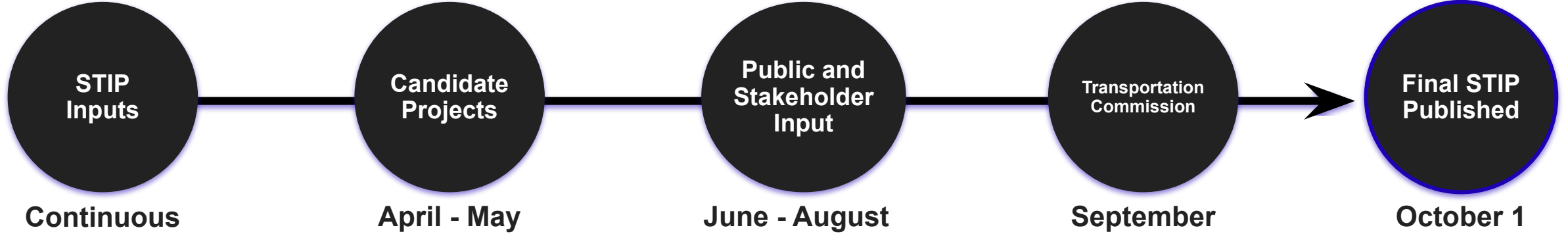
State vs **Federal** Funding

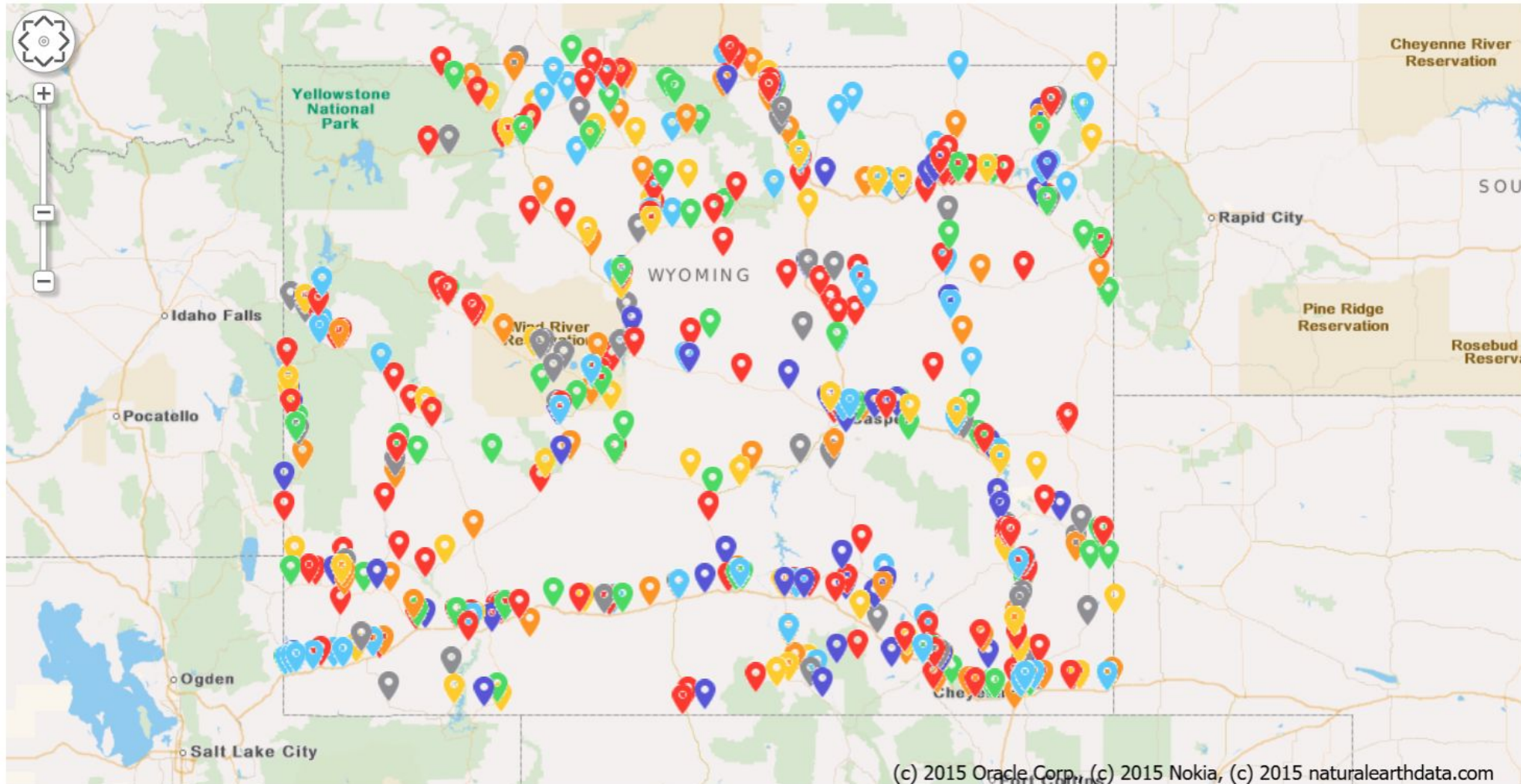

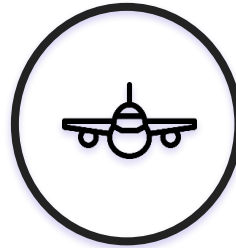

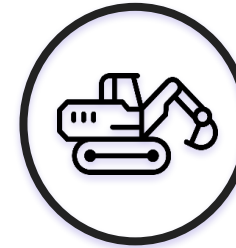

Planning Phase

- STIP Development

Design Phase

- Issuance of design plans

- Public Bidding

Transit Projects

The Federal Transit Administration (FTA) and the Wyoming Legislature annually apportion funds to WYDOT for public transit.

WYDOT funds public transportation in all 23 counties

- Public Transit is primarily provided by senior centers within the state
- Local match is between 15% - 50% depending on the funding type
- Applications are available from March 1st - April 15th annually

Funds are available:

- For operating, administration and routine maintenance of public transit operations
- To replace, rehabilitate and purchase buses and related equipment and to construct bus-related facilities
- Multimodal transportation planning
- Inter-city bus transportation



Aeronautics Projects and Emergency Communications Projects

Aeronautics

Supports planning and construction projects for approximately 40 public use, locally owned airports

Wyoming Aviation Capital Improvement Plan (WACIP):

Maintains a statewide system of airport capital improvement projects.

Emergency Communications

WyoLink*

WyoLink is Wyoming's Statewide, Public Safety, Interoperable Radio Communications System.

*There are no upcoming WyoLink projects in the FY26 STIP.

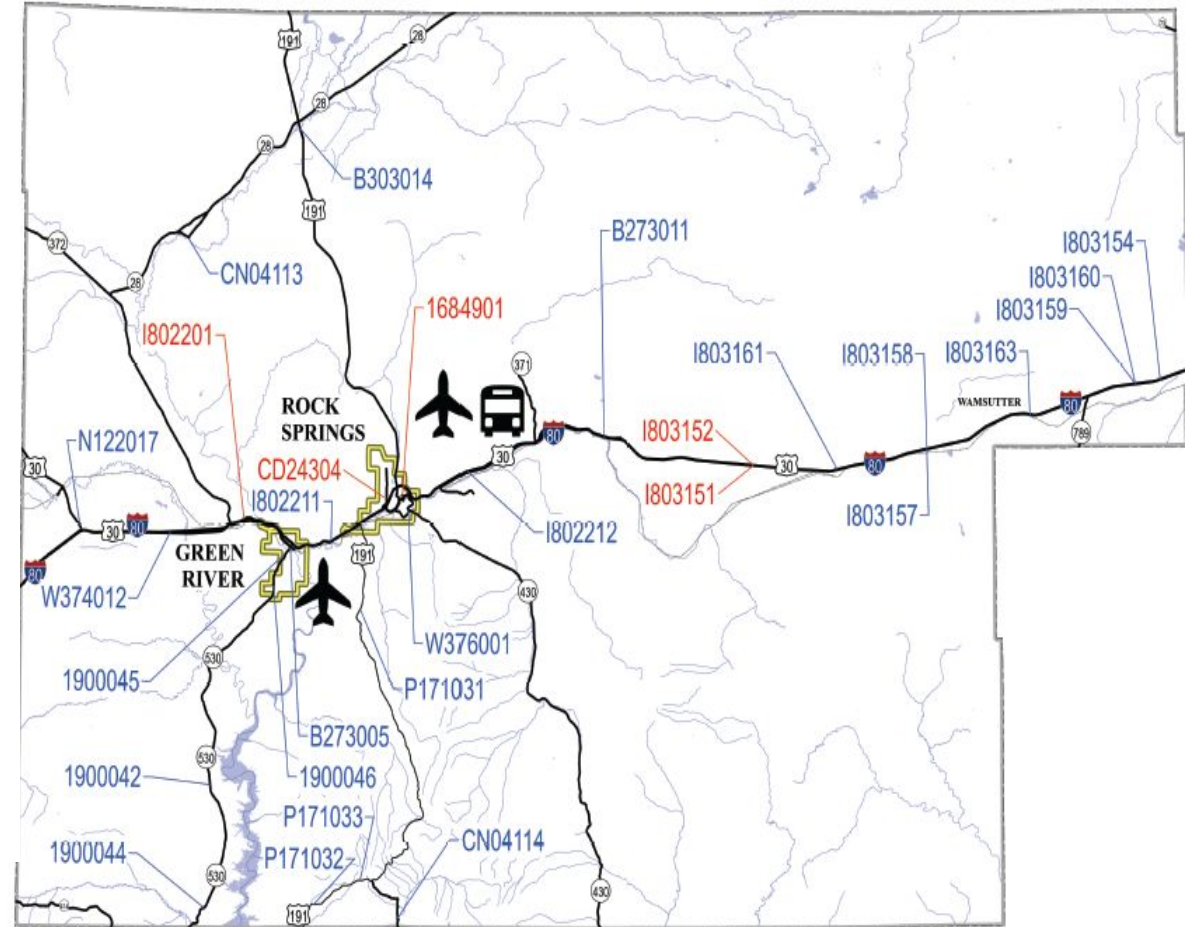
