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Boulevard south to Blairtown Road. WYDOT is partnering with the city of Rock Springs and Sweetwater County to complete the project.

Work will also continue on the \$19.7 million Etna North Project on US 89 between Etna and Alpine, which the commission awarded in September.

Crews will widen a 9-mile section from two lanes to five, creating two lanes northbound, two southbound and a center turning lane. Crews will also perform pavement work on the road to improve the road surface.

Work will continue on the \$19.8 million Interstate 80 Winter Freight Improvement Project, which is funded by a BUILD grant. Crews will install truck climbing lanes on 2 miles eastbound over Halleck Ridge and 2 miles westbound between Cooper Cove and Quealy Dome Road.

The project also includes installing Ft. Steele and Quealy Dome truck parking areas, which will each accommodate about 100 trucks. The commission awarded the contract in September.

Paving and bridge work

WYDOT will continue its work on pavement resurfacing and bridge rehabilitation during this construction season.

The commission already awarded several resurfacing projects on I-80 and is expected to award others in the coming months. With I-80 being a major commercial route, resurfacing projects will repair road surfaces.

Other contracts will be for projects on interstates 25 and 90

as well as the secondary highways.

Additionally, WYDOT will continue work on its bridges. The commission awarded and will award several contracts for bridge deck repairs, approach slab repairs, bridge replacements and other work.

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WYDOT gears up for start of 2021 construction season

Construction season officially beginning with 96 projects statewide this year

The Wyoming Department of Transportation will begin and continue work on several projects in 2021 that will improve the road surface for the traveling public.

Although construction season will officially start in the next few weeks, several projects are already ramping up for the season. The Wyoming Transportation Commission is expected to award about \$330 million in contracts by September. Construction crews will work on 96 projects in 2021.

Construction season means motorists will see more work zones and crews working along the side of the roads.

"Crews will be out working on our roads and bridges so we can continue to improve upon the state's infrastructure," said K. Luke Reiner, WYDOT director. "We want to remind motorists when they are traveling to pay attention, avoid distractions, slow down and follow the signage in our work zones. It is imperative we all do our part to ensure everyone gets home safely."

The following are some highlights of the construction season for this summer.

WYDOT will soon begin work on the \$29.7 million Casper Marginal project on Interstate 25 in Casper. Crews will remove the bridge over Walsh Drive and replace it with a new structure. Detours will be in place when construction begins.

Currently, there are two bridges over



Walsh Drive with two lanes in each direction. The new bridge will be one structure and will have two lanes in each direction.

Crews will also perform storm sewer work, make barrier upgrades and light enhancements. The commission awarded the project at its April meeting.

WYDOT also will start work on a wildlife crossing at Dry Piney on US 189 between La Barge and Dry Piney.

Crews will install fencing and eight wildlife crossings along a 19-mile section. The Dry Piney project will help the Wyoming Range mule deer herd as well as pronghorn, elk and moose movement.

WYDOT received a \$14.5 million

Better Utilizing Investments to Leverage Development (BUILD) grant for the project. The Wyoming Transportation Commission and the Wyoming Game and Fish Commission also contributed \$1.25 million each for a total of \$2.5 million. Additionally, the Greater Yellowstone Coalition and others donated to the project. The project is expected to be awarded later this summer.

Crews will soon start work on the new interchange on Interstate 80 at Rock Springs. WYDOT received a \$14 million federal Infrastructure for Rebuilding America (INFRA) grant to construct a new interchange and reconstruct and expand Interchange Road from Foothill



- B1 Rock Springs East: Grading, draining, placing bases, bituminous surfacing, concrete pavement, bridge rehab, bridge replacement and other work. 12.70 miles on I-80 at MM 107.63 between Rock Springs and Rawlins.
- B2 Kemmerer East: Grading, paving, bridge rehab on 8.90 miles on US 30 at MM 57.99 between Kemmerer and Opal. June 2021 completion.
- B3 La Barge Interchange West: Grading, milling, paving, concrete pavement, bridge rehabs on 5.30 miles of WB I-80 at MM 77.45 between Granger Jct., Green River. October completion.
- B4 US 189 Muddy Creek: Grading, milling, paving, chip seal on 8.20 miles of US 189 at MM 10.23 between Lazeart Jct. and Kemmerer. October completion.
- B5 I-80 east of Lyman. Grading, milling, resurfacing and bridge rehab between MM 49-57. October 2021 completion.

- B9 WYO 239 Bridge work: Bent cap replacement, other work on WYO 239 at MM 0.94 at the Salt River Bridge between Freedom, Idaho State Line.
- Big Piney West: Grading, milling plant mix, bituminous surfacing, reclaimed asphalt pavement on 4.81 miles of WYO 350 at MM 0.25, west of Big Piney.



Legend

- Interstate highway work zones: Generally, there are no delays or detours. Travel may be narrowed to one lane (on pavement) each way and involve a reduced speed limit.
- Two-lane road projects: Motorists may be required to stop and wait to follow pilot cars. Usually, any delays are limited to 20 minutes or less and travel is on pavement.
- Two-lane road projects: At times, motorists may have to drive on gravel or another temporary surface, typically for two miles or less. Delays are limited, there are no detours unless specifically noted but there may be a pilot car.
- District-wide projects: Various locations, may involve reduced speeds.

Not every project is listed

Due to the unpredictable nature of the construction process, not all projects are active all the time. In addition, some short-term projects and smaller projects which disrupt traffic to a lesser degree are not listed. Completion dates are approximate.
